As I and Joseph. reflect on Mary journeying to Bethlehem for that important birth, I think of the preparation that took place. What did they pack, who did they tell, which donkey did they take? All questions that any first century resident would need to ask on a journey of that length. Many of these messages are about preparing the way, getting things ready, or just looking ahead to something special. Can we do the same this year? Can we truly engage in some preparations as we wait with anticipation for the coming Christ child?
