FOOD PANTRY DEMAND SOARS IN 2022

Food for Greater Elgin provides food to people in need through five shopping distributions of food, home deliveries to people confined to home for medical reasons and people living in low income neighborhoods. 2022 has been a difficult year; the special programs providing emergency assistance of food for us to distribute had ended, but the economic disruptions cause by COVID and the large numbers of refugees fleeing to our area from nations like Venezuela and now Ukraine have caused the numbers of people coming to us to soar. In 2021 a total of 81,439 people received so far in 2022 we food from us, have provided food to has soared to 125,189, a 54% increase. And this year is not over yet!

Who are the people turning to us? 79% are from Elgin, 25% are over 60, 73% come to us for food under six times a year. We are a source of emergency food, a way to reduce expenses when it is urgent to cut costs and because you are hungry and don't have food. Few (but more than in the past) come to us weekly.
