#### NOT THE LAST STRAW...

You may have noticed a temporary pile of dirt in the south parking lot a few weeks ago, and lots of straw that is still around that new parking lot. When the new parking lot was installed last fall, the lawn surrounding the parking lot was badly damaged and required lots of repair. After removing the clay and rock left by the pavers, we replaced it with topsoil to provide a good bed upon which to plant new grass. The grass seed has to be kept damp with a combination of frequent watering and having a covering layer of straw. That project is now in the start of its watering phase.

This isn't the best time of year to start grass, fall is a much better time. But the reality of our situation is that you will in fact be seeing a lot more straw this fall. That is because when we finish grading the hill on the north side of our north parking lot, we will be planting it with grass and covering it with a lot of straw. Since we had that project lined up for the fall, we had to move ahead with the south lot lawn repair in the late spring, to get that project out of the way.

The hill on the north side of the north parking lot used to be so steep and irregular, that it could not be mowed. As a result, we had a very unsightly mess of volunteer trees, vines and weeds. With regrading, that hill will be easy to mow, and to keep under control. Our landscaper recommended that we mow that hill for a few years, to eliminate all volunteer plant growth, and then landscape it to improve the view of our church. Whatever we plant there will be easy to maintain and will look good for years to come.
