GENERAL CONFERENCE 2024 BEGINS By: Jarrod Severing Tuesday, April 23rd marked the beginning of the global gathering of The United Methodist Church's General Conference. This is the body, half clergy, half laity, which speaks for the whole church. Decisions are made, legislation is set, and a new Book of Discipline is created. While much of it will remain, there are some changes which are being proposed. These include removal of discriminatory language for the BoD, regionalization, and the revised social principles. Yes, there are many other pieces of legislation which will be voted upon, but with the declining membership and budgets, these will probably have the biggest impact on the UMC. Our prayers are with all the delegates, the bishops, and many others who have gathered in North Carolina to listen for God's voice amid a transitional church and mission. I will certainly try to keep you updated with changes and decisions as they come.

However, I also know that we at Journey of Hope are a community which comes from many different social, financial, educational, and theological backgrounds. We don't all think and believe alike, but can we agree to love alike. Remember that Paul wrote "faith, hope, and love remain, but the greatest of these is love." I understand that some are hoping things stay the same, while others are hoping for a change. In lesser communities, this could divide us, but we are Journey of Hope. Hope is our name-



sake. Hope is foundational to our faith. We place our hope in Jesus Christ, knowing that through the grace of Christ, the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, and the great agape love of God, we can find peace, forgiveness, reconciliation, and acceptance.

Whatever happens at General Conference, please know that we, at Journey of Hope, still have a mission to live out our faith as we make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. That has not, and will not, ever change. We continue the work that God has called us to. We are United Methodist. We are Journey of Hope. We are children of our Creator God.
