

# PARKING LOT REPAVING NEWS!

In the Bible, Revelation says that the streets of heaven are made of Gold. Yet here on Earth our streets, driveways, and parking lots are usually paved in asphalt. And while asphalt is certainly much cheaper than gold, it is still pretty expensive!

Your board of trustees has been thinking about paving for quite some time because of the poor condition of our parking lots. In an ideal world we would remove all the old asphalt from all the parking lots and driveways at the same time, repair the gravel base, and then apply a heavy top layer of asphalt.

To repave everything would cost more money than we have right now. The trustees investigated patching and sealcoating. Four vendors told us that this would be cost prohibitive; it would cost more to patch everything and sealcoat than to repave everything. However, we do have enough money from the first payment of the former Wesley Church sale to begin repaving. Trustees decided that we should give top priority to the worst paving, even if it was not the most visible paving to the general public.

the south/upper lot, closest to Highland Avenue. This lot wasn't made to bear the weight of garbage and recycling trucks every week. Its original asphalt layer is only as thick as residential driveways and is in very poor shape. The new paving will be much thicker than the original layer and include a large cement pad in front of the dumpsters.

The work will be done this fall by the same company that repaved the parking lot at our neighbor, Christ The Lord Lutheran Church. They highly recommendChampion Paving, which came in with the lowest bid of \$91,400.

After the financial transfers in the sale of the old Wesley Church are completed in two years, the trustees will undertake to repave the remainder of our asphalt surfaces.

# From the Desk of Your Pastor

There are times expressed in scripture where people are worshiping God and offering sacrifices with pleasant aromas rising to the heavens. People were asking if the fragrances were pleasing to God. Maybe you've noticed, but in today's worship, there isn't much aroma found in the church. Some still have incense burning or scented candles, certainly we find this in the Catholic church as well as Episcopal churches, but where has this tradition gone in some of the more mainline protestant denominations?

But then I wonder if this is really about our sense of smell, or could it be something a little more spiritual? What if the things that we say or do give off a certain aroma? I wonder what that would smell like to God. Would those wonderful acts of kindness smell like a bed of Easter lilies? Would our acts of justice and compassion smell like a hearty meal with all the fixings? Maybe an act of love would have an aroma of jasmine, rose, or the sweet smell of the ocean surf?

What smell would emit from those acts of selfishness, hatred, anger, or bitterness? How horrible could the aroma of divisive conversations be to our loving God? Maybe the lack of fragrance is a good thing, because we might not like what we are experiencing within the church in general.

We are surrounded by a divided society, both politically and theologically. We can't seem to agree on much of anything. But we are the church, it is not supposed to be that way with us. I want to encourage you to pray for Journey of Hope in the months ahead as we continue to discern God's will for us? Seasons change, and so do we. I'm just glad the pumpkin spice 'everything' doesn't last for more than this one season. Unlike pumpkin spice, God's love for us is eternal.


# **Books for Spirit Lake**
