the 'new' thing that God is providing for us is better than what we had before. If you remember, from what each of you told us in the congregational assessment tool (CAT), we are poised to multiply here at Journey of Hope. This could be another worship service, online presence, satellite location, or an adoption merger. This is in addition to the three goals which were explained during our survey evaluation presentation. Of course, the multiplication will also fit within one or more of the goals. This is truly an exciting time for all of us.

I must also let you know about the Wesley property sale. On August 5th of this year, we held the initial closing of the building sale to Universal Church. Our attorney, Dave Akemann, along with Chuck Keysor, Gary Newton, and myself were there to finalize the sale with signatures. Representatives from Universal Church were not there as they finalized their end of the paperwork on August 8th.

There was an initial down payment of \$187,000.00 which after closing costs, netted Journey of Hope \$151,323.29. We now enter into a two-year contract where we will receive monthly installment payments of \$3,750.00 which includes 4% interest and principal payments. The final closing date is set for August 2024 where we will receive the payment for the remaining balance.

This has been a long process and I want to offer my thanks to Dave Akemann for being so diligent in making sure paperwork was correct and the many phone calls and emails to facilitate this closing sale. Also, a big thank you to your trustees for staying the course and bringing this chapter to a partial close, as we will have to wait two years for the final closing. I know that this news might bring some emotional responses as this was a beautiful church in the Northern Illinois Conference of The United Methodist Church for many years. Wesley UMC served this community well and was accentuated with the missional gifts to the Elgin community just prior to the merger.

While this building is no longer a United Methodist Church, we know that God is still providing through the foundation that was laid by many current members and saints from the past. God is using this building to continue reaching into this community through Universal Church and we pray that lives will be changed through the ministries offered within those walls. Journey of Hope offers our warmest blessings for the leadership of that church, and pray for all who will continue walking through the doors on South Street. Yes, something new!
