THE COMFORT QUILT, PART 1

Here it is. My first newsletter article, written on my first official day as JOH-Bartlett campus leader, after my first Journey of Hope staff meeting. What a day. I am thrilled to be here. That said, I wasn't sure what I would write about. Then I found the 'Comfort Quilt.' I was back in what used to be, and perhaps will be again one day, the youth room. Like many disused rooms in many churches, it has become a sort of catch-all storage room for parts and pieces of ministry from years gone by. A small black journal caught my eye. I am, by nature, a curious (read nosy) fella. This journal was started by a woman named Ruth Schlitter. She made the quilt in 2014 and prayed over the quilt and shared it with others who were having difficult times as an object of hope and warmth, grace, and peace. There were a few entries from folks who had held the quilt for a few days or a few weeks, even a few months. People who were ill and people who were grieving. I looked around and there, under some other stuff, was the quilt. At the bottom of the first page of the journal was a www.jamisonschmitz website: funeralhome.com. I was shocked.

I took the quilt to the office where Diane, Lynda, and Sherry were finishing putting a mailing together and asked them about it. They said it had been gifted to the church by Dale Schlitter, a long time member of the church who had moved away a few years ago.

I've never been one to look for signs from God but I've also never been one to doubt too hard when I find something I believe to be one.

The inscription on the quilt said, "Sisters of Grace United Methodist Church 'Traveling Comfort Quilt' To offer peace, love, and serenity to those in need. Made with Christian love by Ruth Schlitter 2014 Oelwein,

I believe this is where I
am supposed to be and
I am glad to be in
ministry with you.

Iowa." Oelwein, Iowa is one of the larger towns in Fayette County, Iowa in Northeast Iowa. It is a rural area buffeted on its' west and south by a large Amish community. I served in small, rural United Methodist Churches in that area for 10 years. The journal is signed by one of the pastors I worked with when she pastored Grace UMC in Oelwein. I have been in that church many times and I have preached several funerals in the funeral home mentioned above. My wife and I think we may know two of the other ladies who signed the journal. One of the

scriptures on the quilt comes from Ecclesiastes 3. "There is a time for everything, a season for all things under heaven." This quilt and its' story, more than just the whole, 'wow, it's a small world,' factor gave me a sense of call and belonging in this place that only adds to the sense of welcome and invitation I have received from everyone I have met so far. I believe this is where I am supposed to be and I am glad to be in ministry with you.

Next month I'll tell you about the conversation I had with Dale when I called him up. Thank goodness churches keep old church directories...

A couple weeks ago, before Thanksgiving, I wrote in a field journal about slowing down in our lives. I wonder if any of you took that message to heart? Have you slowed down? 
